*Jim Shackelford, ESMT (Equine Sport Massage Therapist) is a specialist in horse rehab and behavior, founder of Natural Horse Wellness, and originator of the Moment Methods™. He is known for his unique and provocative clinics, taking us deep within a horse's energetic conversation with us by showing it hands-on.*

*Jim, resides in Ashland, and has ten years practicing in Oregon and California, with a reputation for correcting lameness issues in sometimes one or two sessions.*

*His clients' horses include champions of the show ring, thoroughbred racing, 2010 National Points leader in barrel-racing, and at least seven other World Champions including Magistick and Word On The Street.*
