

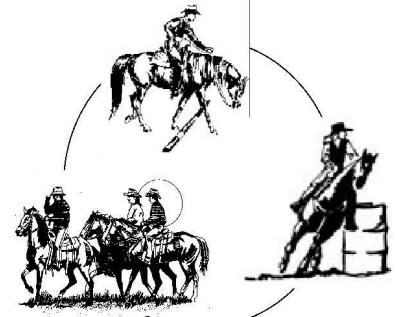

Lily Glen - July 2-4, 2011

Camping:

We have Lily Glen Group Camp Areas A & B reserved for Saturday and Sunday nights, July 2nd & 3rd. There are several camping spaces (which will be shared). Overflow campers will be placed in the adjacent meadow. The camp has vault toilets, a fresh water hand pump and 32 corrals. Corrals go fast, so plan to bring portable corrals, hot wire or highline. Cost for camping is \$16 per night per family (i.e. - one truck/trailer combination). If you choose to camp in the first-come-first-serve area to the left of the entrance you must pay the County Park camp fee. You are welcome to come on Friday, but you will need to pay the park camp fee for that night. NOTE: Certified Weed Free Hay is **NOT** required at this camp.

BBQ & Potluck & Games:

Saturday evening around 6:00ish: The club will provide the BBQ meat. Bring a dish to share (side dish, salad or dessert). Bring your own table service, chairs and beverages. We will also be playing the Corn Holin' Game!!

Raffle:

You may purchase raffle tickets for \$5 per arm-length. Place them in the bucket of the prize you wish to win. Drawing will be held at the Saturday potluck.

Trail Horse Trials:

Saturday, July 2nd, the ride begins at 10:00am with the last rider out by 11:00am. Cost is \$10 per person. Divisions are Junior (17 & under) and Senior (18 & over). There are obstacles along the trail that you and your equine will be judged on. Only one horse & rider may go through an obstacle at a time. If you choose to pony a second horse, judges will not be responsible for holding it. Awards will be given to the top three scores in each division.

Lingo & Poker Ride:

Both of these events are on the same trail, and runs concurrent with the Trail Trials. (You may participate in one or all three events.) Lingo (aka Bingo) numbers are posted along the trail. Participants mark off the numbers on their cards. A blackout wins the money pot. If no blackout occurs, the card with the fewest numbers left wins. Ties will split the pot. Cards are \$5 each or 3 cards for \$12. One-half of the money collected goes in the Lingo money pot. The Poker Ride will run the same way. You will draw a 5-card hand. Best high hand will received one-half of the money collected. One hand is \$5 or 3 hands are \$12.

Gymkhana:

Sunday, July 3rd, beginning at 10:00am is the fun Gymkhana in the meadow adjacent to camp. Note: This is a rough field, not a groomed arena! There will be five timed events, with four age divisions. Prizes given to the top finishers. Events are \$5 each or all for \$20.

'How To' Clinic:

Monday, July 4th, beginning at 11:00am. Just some fun interesting mini clinics on horse stuff. Free to all participants.

Rules:

1) No stallions allowed at the campout or in the events. 2) No dogs allowed on the ride. If you bring dogs to the campout they must be kept tied up in your camp or on a leash. 3) All children 12 years of age and younger are required to wear a safety helmet while riding in any event. 4) Riders under 18 years of age must be accompanied by a responsible adult rider. 5) All standard county park rules apply.

Registration:

We are offering a discount for pre-registration. Fill out the form attached to this flyer, add up the total amount and subtract 10% if you are a non-club member or 20% if you belong to JCHA. Mail the completed form and check to: JCHA, PO Box 765, Medford, OR 97501 by June 20, 2011. Request for cancellation refund MUST be received by June 30, 2011. No refunds will be given after this date.

Directions to Lily Glen:

The shortest route is to take I-5 south to Ashland exit 14. Head east on Dead Indian Memorial Hwy for about 17 miles, climbing up the steep, winding mountain then dropping down toward Howard Prairie Reservoir. Go past the turnoff to Howard Prairie Resort approx. 1/2 mile and watch for the camp on the right. For an easier haul, but a few extra miles, take Hwy 140 from White City east towards Klamath Falls for 28 miles then turn on to FS Rd 37 - North Fork Campground Road. Follow it to the end (9 miles) and turn right on Dead Indian Memorial Hwy. Lily Glen is about 4 miles on the left.
