## QUINN MEADOWS CAMPOUT

The group campout at Quinn Meadows Horse camp is July 27-30<sup>th</sup>. If you were one of the lucky people to call ReserveUSA on the correct date back in December and get a site but can not attend and are willing to sell your site, please call Debbie at 664-1635. We have members that would like to go.

This campout was planned last December at the monthly meeting and announced in a couple newsletters. The US Forest Service/ReserveUSA allows reservations to be made 240 days prior to your arrival date. With the very popular horse camps, Quinn Meadows being high on that list, they fill as fast as the 240 days rolls around. It is not a group camp, so sites can only be reserved on an individual basis.

Quinn Meadows, located on the Cascade Lakes Hwy west of Bend, has 26 sites, most with 2-horse corrals and a few with 4-horse corrals. They are very strict about only one horse per corral and no horses are allowed tied outside corrals, so don't try doubling up with someone. The camp host will ask you to leave. From the camp you can ride into the beautiful Three Sisters Wilderness.

This is a no-host campout. There will be a potluck on Saturday night so bring a dish to share and table service. Debbie will have copies from the Three Sisters Wilderness map available at July's meeting.
