

LILY GLEN HORSE CAMP

Ashland, OR

Directions

The shortest route is to take I-5 South to second Ashland exit. Head east on Dead Indian Memorial Hwy for about 17 miles, climbing up the steep mountain then dropping down toward Howard Prairie Reservoir. Go past the turnoff to Howard Prairie Resort approx. 1/2 mile and watch for the corrals on the right. For an easier haul, but a few extra miles, take Hwy 140 from White City east toward Klamath Falls for 28 miles then turn off (south) at North Fork Campground Road. Follow it to the end (9 miles) and turn right on Dead Indian Memorial Hwy. Lily Glen is about 4 miles on the left.

Facilities

There are two group reservation areas that share 32 corrals and each have several campsites. A first-come first-serve camping area is just inside the gate to the left. There are 8 sites available, some with 2-horse corrals. Also, a handicap site is near the restroom. There are two hand pumps for potable and horse water, fire pits and restrooms for both areas. There is a designated manure dump site within camp. Bring a wheelbarrow. This is a heavily used area from June to September.



Fees

First-come area is \$16.00 per campsite with two horses. The group sites are by reservation only and are currently \$125 for Area A and \$75 for Area B. Check with Jackson County Parks and Recreation (541-774-8183) for updated fee information and to make reservations.

Description

Wonderful, easy, riding trails abounds in this area. You may ride around the shore of Howard Prairie Reservoir or just wander on the many unmapped trails. You may ride anywhere on the north or south side of Dead Indian Memorial Hwy, most of which is BLM. This was once the stage stop between Klamath Falls and Ashland. There is a small stream to cross in the summer (larger in early spring) but most horses cross with no problems. Sadly, the historic barn burned down in 2003.
