

# QUINN MEADOW HORSE CAMP

Bend, OR

## Directions

From Medford go north on Crater Lake Highway (62) to Hwy 230 to Diamond Lake and then go right on Hwy 138 to Hwy 97. Go north on Hwy 97. Continue north on 97 past the exit to Hwy 58 (Oakridge), to the little town of Crescent. Turn left in the middle of Crescent at the sign "Cascade Lakes Highway - 9 miles. Turn right on Cascade Lakes Hwy (46). Stay on this all the way to Quinn Meadows about 40-50 miles. Watch for Elk Lake Resort, then in about 2 miles you will come up a rise and the turnoff to Quinn will be on the right. There are signs a couple hundred yards before the entrance. Have the combination to the gate handy, as there is only room to park one truck/trailer in front of the gate! It's about a mile down the dirt road to the camp. Total driving time from Medford is about 4 hours.

## Facilities

There are 24 camping sites. A few have four-horse corrals, but the majority is two-horse corrals. Most sites are back-in, but there are a few pull through on the uphill side. All sites have picnic tables, fire rings and flat area for tenting. There are newer vault toilets, hand pumped drinking water, dumpsters and a meeting shelter. The manure dump is out of camp about 1/8 mile. Bring your own bags and come prepared to haul your manure. There is a camp host on site from June to September. This camp is behind a locked gate. You will be given the combination when you make a reservation.

## Reservations/Fees

This horse camp is by reservation only. Sites can be reserved through ReserveUSA (877-444-6777) 240 days prior to arrival. Sites with two horse corrals are \$14 of first vehicle/RD per night and sites with four horse corrals are \$16. This is a very popular camp. So make your reservations early.

## Description

This wonderful, well maintained camp is located within a mile of the Three Sisters Wilderness. Many trails lead out of camp into the wilderness and there are many loops to choose from. A tunnel goes under the highway for easy access to the trails. You can also ride to Elk or Lave Lake resorts. It is advisable to purchase a Three Sisters Wilderness map before going. The trails in this area do get very dusty in the late summer.
