

THREE CREEK MEADOW HORSE CAMP

Sisters, OR

Directions

From Medford go north on Crater Lake Highway (62) to Hwy 230 to Diamond Lake and then go right on Hwy 138 to Hwy 97. Go north on Hwy 97. Continue north on 97 through Bend to Hwy US20 West. Once you are on Hwy US20 it is about 22 miles to Sisters. When you reach Sisters watch for the Forest Service sign right in the middle of town directing you to turn left for FS Road 16 – Three Creeks. Once on this road it is about 15 miles to the camp. It is paved except for the last mile which is pretty rough, but passable. Just go slow. The road is also has a few steep sections. When you start to drop down and can see the meadow on the right, the first road goes into the non-horse camp. You can go this way, but a straighter shot into horse camp is to continue PAST the first sign and go about 200 yards to the next road to the right. This comes into a large day use where you can park and walk around to get your bearings.... and camp site.

Facilities

There are 9 camping sites. Each site has a four-horse corral, picnic table and fire ring. There are two vault toilets, two manure dumps and garbage cans serving the camp. There are also two water troughs that stay full all summer. There is **no** potable water within 15 miles. All the sites are back-in. This camp is directly adjacent to the Three Creek Meadow (non-horse) camp. There is a camp host on site for both camps from June to September. The camp is operated by a concessionaire - Hoodoo Recreation.

Reservations/Fees

This horse camp has no reservations. All sites are first-come, first-serve. If the camp is full there is dispersed camping to the left on the entrance road. Ask the camp host for help locating it. All sites are \$12 for the first vehicle/RV per night.

Description

This old camp is located within a couple miles of the Three Sisters Wilderness. Several trail options lead out of camp to the wilderness. The Metolius-Windigo trail also runs right past the camp. Nice day trips are to Park Meadows, headwaters of Snow Creek and Tam McArthur Rim. It is advisable to get a Three Sisters Wilderness map before going. The trails in this area do get very dusty in the late summer.
