Jackson County Horseman's Association Lily Glen –June 28-29, 2024

Camping:

We have reserved Group Camp Area A only for Friday and Saturday nights, June 28 & 29. There are several camping spaces (which will be shared). Overflow campers will be placed in the adjacent meadow. No reserves on specific campsites or corrals; first come – first choice. The camp has vault toilets, a fresh water hand pump and 32 corrals. Corrals go fast, so plan to bring portable corrals, hot wire or highline. Cost for camping is \$18 per night per family (i.e. - one truck/trailer combination). If you camp in the no reservation area to the left of the entrance you must pay the County Park camp fee of \$22/night (includes 1 vehicle) with maximum of 8 people per camp site. Please practice "Leave NO Trace" in camp areas, stalls, and trails. Come prepared to clean up after your horses! NOTE: Certified Weed Free Hay is NOT required at this camp.

Potluck:

Saturday evening at 5:30pm we will have a potluck at the sign up area. Please bring a **main dish** to share with the group. BBQ hamburgers, buns, condiments& table service will be provided by the club. Bring a chair and beverage of your choice.

Raffle and Silent Auction:

You may purchase raffle tickets for \$5 per arm-length. Place them in the bucket of the prize you wish to win. Silent Auction items will be available all day for bidding. Drawing of raffle and winners of silent auction will be announced Saturday evening after the potluck.

Lingo & Poker Ride:

Saturday June 29th Both of these events are on the same trail (You can participate in one or both events.) Lingo (aka Bingo) numbers are posted along the trail. Participants mark off the numbers on their cards. A blackout wins the money pot. If no blackout occurs, the card with the fewest numbers left wins. Ties will split the pot. Cards are \$5 each or 3 cards for \$12. One half of the money collected goes to the winner(s). The Poker Ride will run the same way. You will draw a 5-card hand. Highest hand and lowest hand will split the money. One hand is \$5 or 3 hands for \$12. Winners will be announced Saturday evening after the potluck.

Rules:

1) No stallions allowed at the campout or in the events. 2) No dogs allowed on the event rides and **Per JC Parks Rules- If you bring dogs to the campout they must be kept tied up in your camp or on a leash at all times**. 3) All children 17 years of age and younger are required to wear a safety helmet while riding in any event. 4) Heeled boots required for all riders for all events. 5) Riders under 18 years of age must be accompanied by a responsible adult rider. 6) All standard county park rules apply.

Registration:

We are offering a discount for pre-registration. Fill out the form attached to this flyer, add up the total amount and subtract 10% if you are a non-club member or 20% if you belong to JCHA. No refunds will be given after this date.

Directions to Lily Glen:

The shortest route is to take I-5 south to Ashland exit 14. Head east on Dead Indian Memorial Hwy for about 17 miles, climbing up the steep, winding mountain then dropping down toward Howard Prairie Reservoir. Go past the turnoff to Howard Prairie Resort approx. 1/2 mile and watch for the camp on the right.

For an easier haul, but a few extra miles, take Hwy 140 from White City east towards Klamath Falls for 28 miles then tum onto FS Rd 37 - North Fork Campground Road. Follow it to the end (9 miles) and turn right on Dead Indian Memorial Hwy. Lily Glen is about 4 miles on the left.
